RULES and REGULATIONS.

Sr. No	Rules and Regulations.
R. M. Arch (CBCS) 1	The teaching and Examination scheme shall be according to the Structure and Syllabi Prescribed, subject to revision, modification, etc. as made by the Academic Council from time to time on the recommendations of the Board of Studies of Architecture.
R. M. Arch (CBCS) 2	<p>i) The M. Arch program shall be of Two years with Four semesters. The Examination shall be conducted semester wise as per prescribed structure and the result shall be declared year wise.</p> <p>ii) There shall be separate heads of passing as per the prescribed structure.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">a) Theory- Minimum passing marks 45%.b) Sessional work- Minimum passing marks 50%.c) Viva (oral) - Minimum passing marks 45%. <p>iii) The candidate will be permitted to appear for the examinations at the end of each semester only if he/she</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">a) keeps term at a college affiliated to the university and produces testimonials from the Principal for,<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 75% attendance in each head of passing of Theory and / or Sessional work as prescribed in the structure.• Satisfactory completion of the Sessional Work prescribed for all subjects and secured at least 50% marks in the Sessional Assessment.
R. M. Arch (CBCS) 3	<p>i) The Sessional work of all semesters, shall be continuously assessed by the Internal Teacher during each semester.</p> <p>ii) The schedule for submission of assignments and marking scheme shall be displayed and informed to the students by the subject teachers.</p>
R. M. Arch (CBCS) 4	iii) The Viva (Oral) Assessment will be done by a panel of Internal Examiner and External Examiner appointed by the university at the end of each semester one week before commencement of theory examination.
R. M. Arch (CBCS) 5	<p>i) When term-work in any subject is assessed the marks will be carried over to subsequent examination, unless the candidate rejoins an affiliated college as a regular student in the corresponding semester and chooses to submit fresh term work.</p> <p>ii) A candidate whose marks are thus carried over is eligible for award of class.</p>
R. M. Arch (CBCS) 6	Standard of Passing.

	<p>i) To pass in each semester Examination a candidate must obtain minimum 45% marks in theory paper and Viva (Oral) exam in each passing head.</p> <p>ii) Aggregate of Sem I and Sem II of a particular year shall be considered as a separate head of passing for the result of that concerned year and minimum marks for passing shall be 50%.</p> <p>iii) A 10 point grading system with corresponding letter grades and percentage of marks as given below is followed.</p> <p>The SGPA shall be calculated for semester wise and CGPA shall be calculated at the end of all semesters.</p> <p>For calculation of CGPA, a formulae given in guidelines shall be used.</p> <p><u>Calculation of SGPA & CGPA</u></p> <p>1. Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)</p> $\text{SGPA} = \frac{\sum (\text{Course credits} \times \text{Grade points obtained}) \text{ of a Semester}}{\sum (\text{Course credits}) \text{ of respective Semester}}$ <p>2. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)</p> $\text{CGPA} = \frac{\sum (\text{Total credits of a Semester} \times \text{SGPA of respective Semester}) \text{ of all semesters}}{\sum (\text{Total course credits}) \text{ of all Semesters}}$

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	<p>a) Candidate should have secured a CGPA 5.00 or more but less than 6.50 in examination will be declared to have passed the examination in second class.</p> <p>b) Candidate should have secured a CGPA 6.50 Or more but less than 7.50 in examination will be declared to have passed in First class.</p> <p>c) Candidate should have secured a CGPA of not less than 7.50 in examination will be declared to have passed in First class with distinction.</p> <p>d) Marks obtained ≥ 0.5 shall be rounded off to next higher digit.</p> <p>e) The SGPA and CGPA shall be considered upto 2 decimal points only.</p>																																							
R. M. Arch (CBCS) 7	<p>a) In case a candidate fails to less than 50% aggregate marks in a semester examination, he /she will be allowed, at his option to re-appear for only those heads of passing in which he/she has got less than 60% marks, at his subsequent examination. His / Her Previous performance in such a case should be treated as null and void.</p> <p>b) The marks obtained by candidate in any head of passing at any Semester Examination will be carried forward unless the candidate reappears for that head of passing in accordance with (a) above. A candidate whose marks are thus carried over is eligible for class.</p>																																							

	<p>c) A candidate failing in any sessional work examination of the semester will be detained and will not be allowed to appear for the Theory and Viva (Oral) Examination of that semester. The candidate will have to rejoin as a regular student of the corresponding semester. Such candidate will be eligible for award of class.</p> <p>d) When a candidate wishes to reappear for the final dissertation examination due to unsatisfactory performance, he/ she will have to resubmit the dissertation with suitable modification and must also reappear for the Viva (Oral) Examination on it.</p>
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
